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
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JARAWAS





Visualise the results


Imagination is the key to positive thinking. It can uplift one's self-confidence and performance thereby helping you take steps toward success. Visualising your future gives a pathway to success.


Dasara is a high adrenaline action, revenge drama that is set in the backdrop of singareni coal mines. The movie, the characters and dialogues are all out and out Telangana.


